

Family Research

Are you trying to find out about your family members or people in your neighbourhood who lived in the Parish of Gairloch?

If so Gairloch Museum might be able to help. Things to think about:

- Have you some names? The more you can provide the easier it may be.
- Do you know any dates? We are likely to hold more information for queries dated between 1841 and 1921.
- What about the actual area? We cover Second Coast (Laide area) through to Diabaig.

The resources we use that are most helpful are:

- The census forms (1841 to 1921).
- The Gairloch Rental Records (1707 to 1864) – these are computerised but rarely provide more than men's names, the area in which they lived & sometimes their occupations.

- OPRs (Old Parochial Records) for baptisms and marriages from around 1800. If these help then there might be other pieces of information that can help (such as Valuation Rolls).

Are you wanting to know about a particular croft, crofting township or building?
