

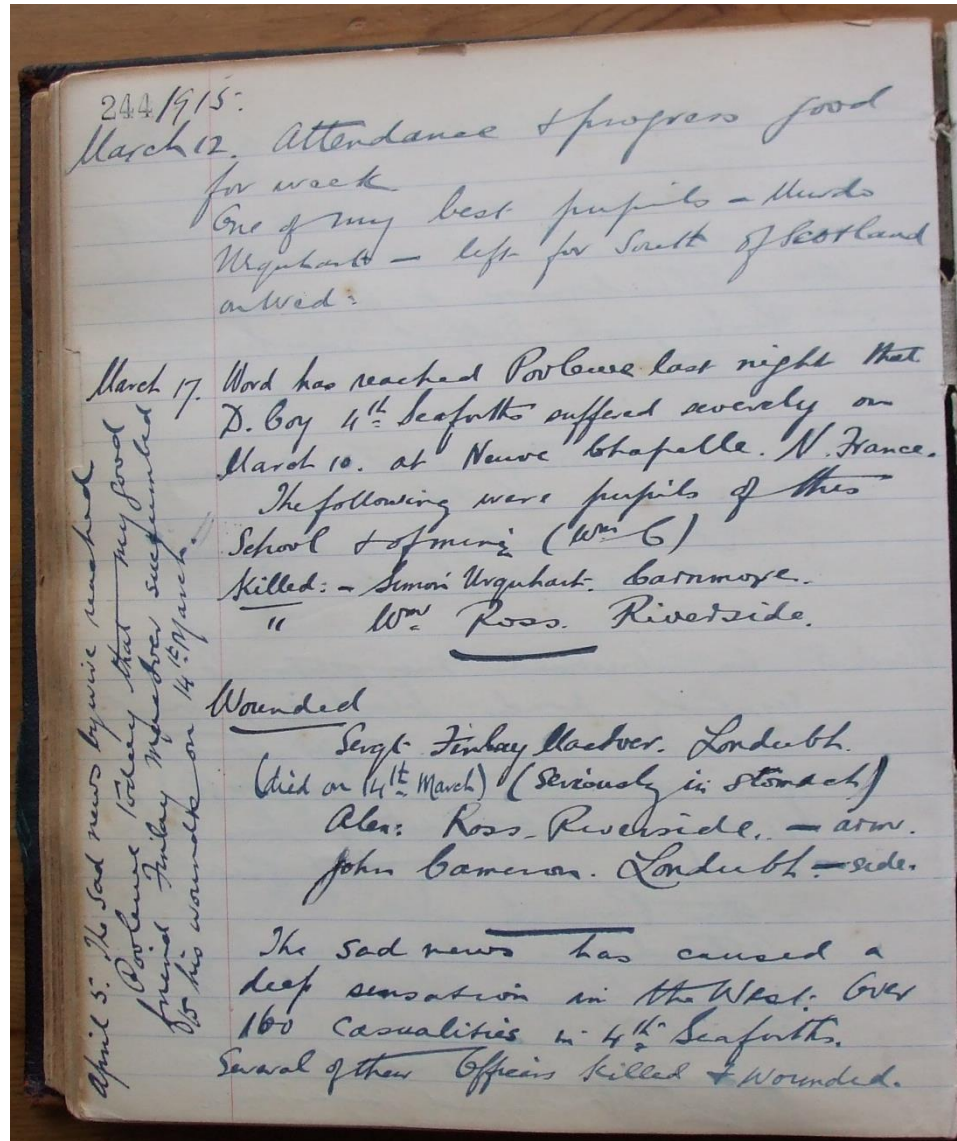
Poolwe School log book entry

good.
23. Attendance pretty good—
Potato lifting.
Alex. Mackenzie Postman,
has been attending school for

Annie Urquhart Telegraphist,
P.O. is now attending school
under Art: 29. III.
Nov: 6 Duncan Urquhart has been
awarded a Silver Medal
Just Bursary of £12-10/- for
3 years tenable at Highland
H.G. School L. Govan, in all
£18-10/-. He proceeds there next
week.

Word has come yesterday
that the Poolwe section

of Territorials proceeds at once
to the front with their regiment
4th Seaforth's. Poolwe has
sent 26 men (22 in 4th Seaforth's)
in all to Army which is
excellent for a small place
of 240 inhabitants, about
11%. 20 of these have
recently been pupils of
Poolwe School.
Nov 9th. We visited this school today, and examined
it in Religious Knowledge which was found
very satisfactory. Prizes were also given
to the children who merited the same.

Date	Event
	initiated school 5-day - America Independence Day - and spoke a few appropriate words to the children -
9.7.18	children brought along money collected for the Scottish Red Cross Society - £5.7.11
22.7.18	all the children were up at Inverness most on Sat the 27 th collecting Spagnum Moss. 6 bags collected - afterwards Mrs Hanbury gave us all a splendid tea - and a service of fruit.
26.7.18	School closed to-day for the usual autumn holidays.
9.9.18	School re-opened to-day after the usual six weeks' holiday - attendance good.
19.9.18	We have examined this school to-day in Religious knowledge & distributed prizes provided by the School-Board W. MacKinnon D. Morrison.
2.10.18	School closes this afternoon for the Aulthorpe communion - re-opens Tuesday the 8 th

Poolwe School log book entry 11 November 1918

Date	Entry
18.10.18	No claim for front under art 21(b)(2) of the Code is under consideration -
1.11.18	Attendance has not been good this week. Children kept at home to help in lifting potatoes
5.11.18	The same remark applies to this week.
11.11.18	To-day news has come by wire that hostilities have ceased on the continent. The armistice had been signed at 11 o'clock to-day. Naturally we spent the rest of the day in discussing some of the outstanding events since 1914 and paid special attention to details re the generals and admirals which brought our troops to victory.
20.11.18	Tomorrow being the Thanksgiving day for the harvest in this parish the school will be closed.
2.12.18	Owing to the dark afternoons and this distance from school of some of the children the school dismiss at 2.30 p.m. daily for Dec & Jan. No dinner hour fixed.
5.12.18	To-day being observed by the Free Church as a day of thanksgiving for the termination of the war
